American Indian Achievement Gap Data Report

Biannual Report - September 2026

Introduction

In 2007, the Montana State Legislature passed Montana Code Annotated 20-9-330, appropriating \$200 per American Indian child, totaling over \$3 million per year, to provide funding to school districts for the purpose of closing the educational achievement gap that exists between American Indian students and non-Indian students. According to MCA 20-9-330(2)(a), funds are to be determined by “. . . using the number of American Indian students enrolled in the district based on the count of regularly enrolled students on the first Monday in October of the prior school year as reported to the office of public instruction” and deposited into the district’s general fund. The Montana Office of Public Instruction (OPI) prepared this report to track the American Indian achievement gap and provide data on the Montana American Indian student population.

Important Note on the Race/Ethnicity Data in the American Indian Achievement Gap Report:

The underlying legislation authorizing the American Indian Achievement Gap Report, “20-9-330. American Indian achievement gap payment,” is intended to support all American Indian students in Montana, including those who may identify with more than one race/ethnicity. The OPI follows a two-part race/ethnicity and multiracial population methodology for all state- and federally required reports except for the American Indian Achievement Gap Report. Therefore, students who otherwise are identified as “multiracial” in other published data and reports are identified and accounted for as American Indian students in this report if one of the races they identify with is American Indian. Please use caution when comparing or referencing data published in the American Indian Achievement Gap Report with other published data and reports.

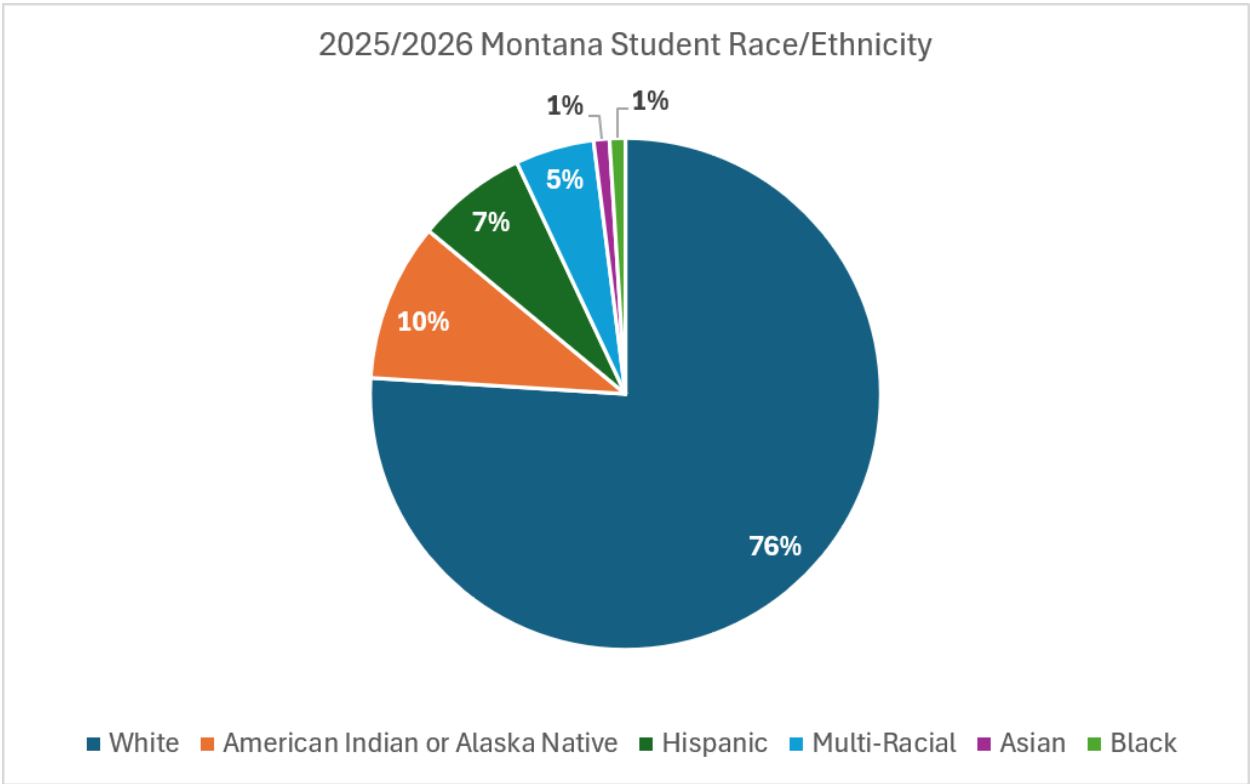

The *total number of American Indian students* reflects the total number of students who identify as American Indian and *the total number of American Indian plus multi-race students* includes all students who identify as American Indian and multi-race with at least one race being American Indian.

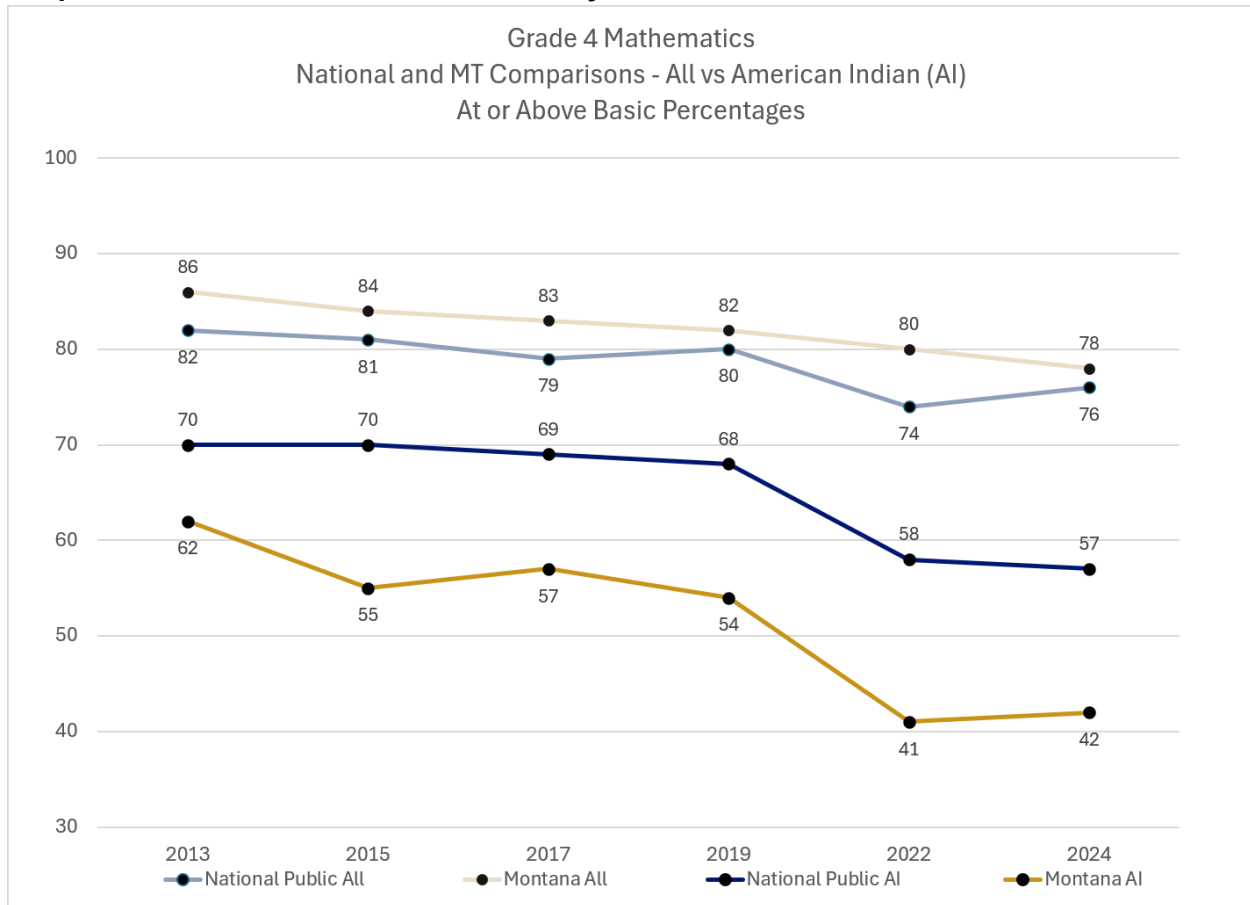
Figure 1 displays the race/ethnicity of Montana’s enrolled students during the 2025/2026 school year, showing 10% of students identified themselves as American Indian.

National Assessment of Education Progress (NAEP)

NAEP is a congressionally mandated program that is overseen and administered by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), within the U.S. Department of Education and the Institute of Education Sciences. Also known as The Nation’s Report Card, NAEP has provided meaningful results to improve education policy and practice since 1969. Results are available for the nation, states, and 27 urban districts. The National Assessment Governing Board, an independent body appointed by the Secretary of Education, sets NAEP policy.

NAEP assessment data highlights persistent achievement and proficiency gaps for American Indian and Alaska Native students nationwide. The graphs below show the national proficiency rates for American Indian (AI) students as compared to all students for reading and math in grades 4 and 8.

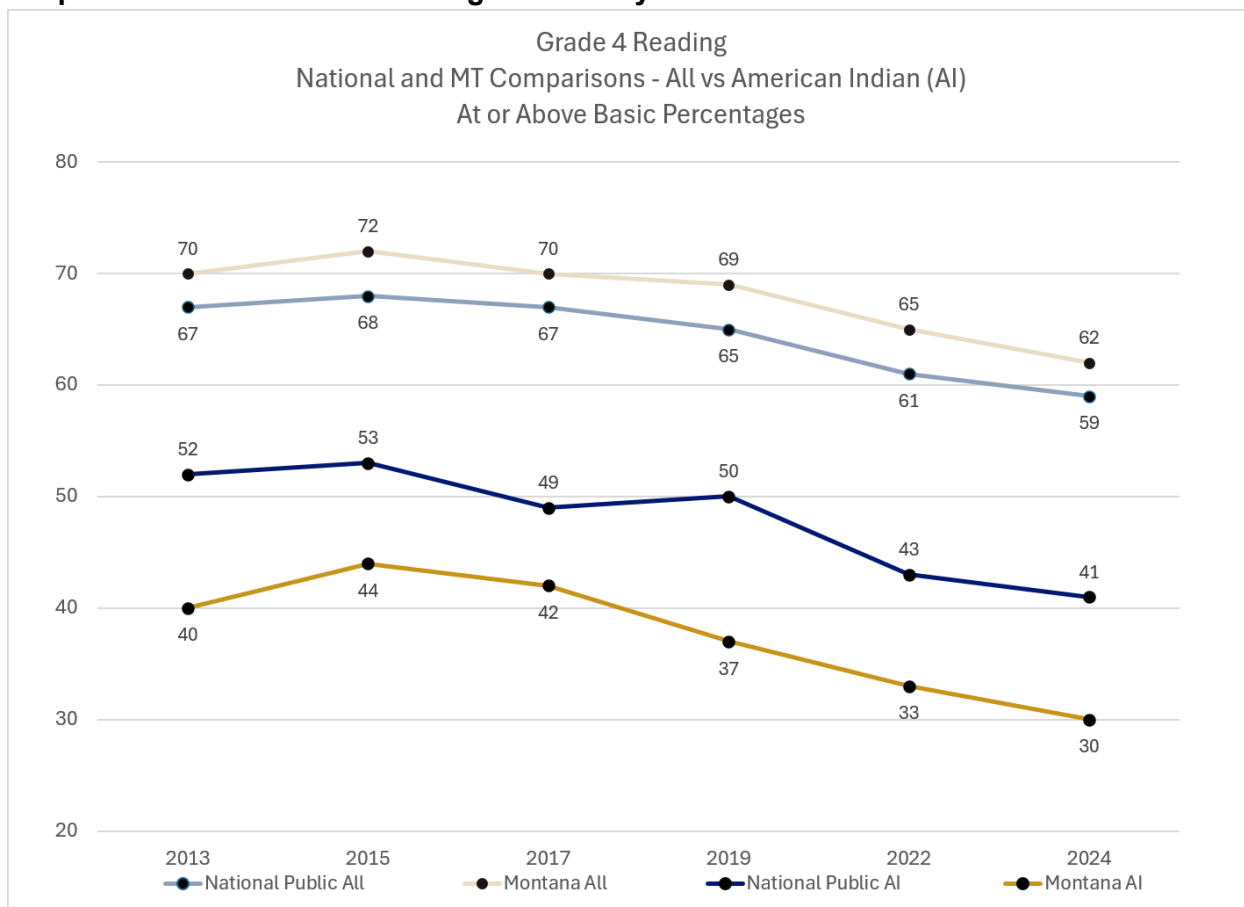
Graph 1. NAEP 4th Grade Math Proficiency for AI and All Students 2013-2024

Graph 1 shows the NAEP national and state trends for 4th grade American Indian (AI) students and all students in public schools that score "At or Above Basic" in mathematics. For the years shown, Montana students (*Montana All*) scored higher than the national average (*National Public All*) while Montana AI students (*Montana AI*) scored lower than the national average for AI students (*National Public AI*).

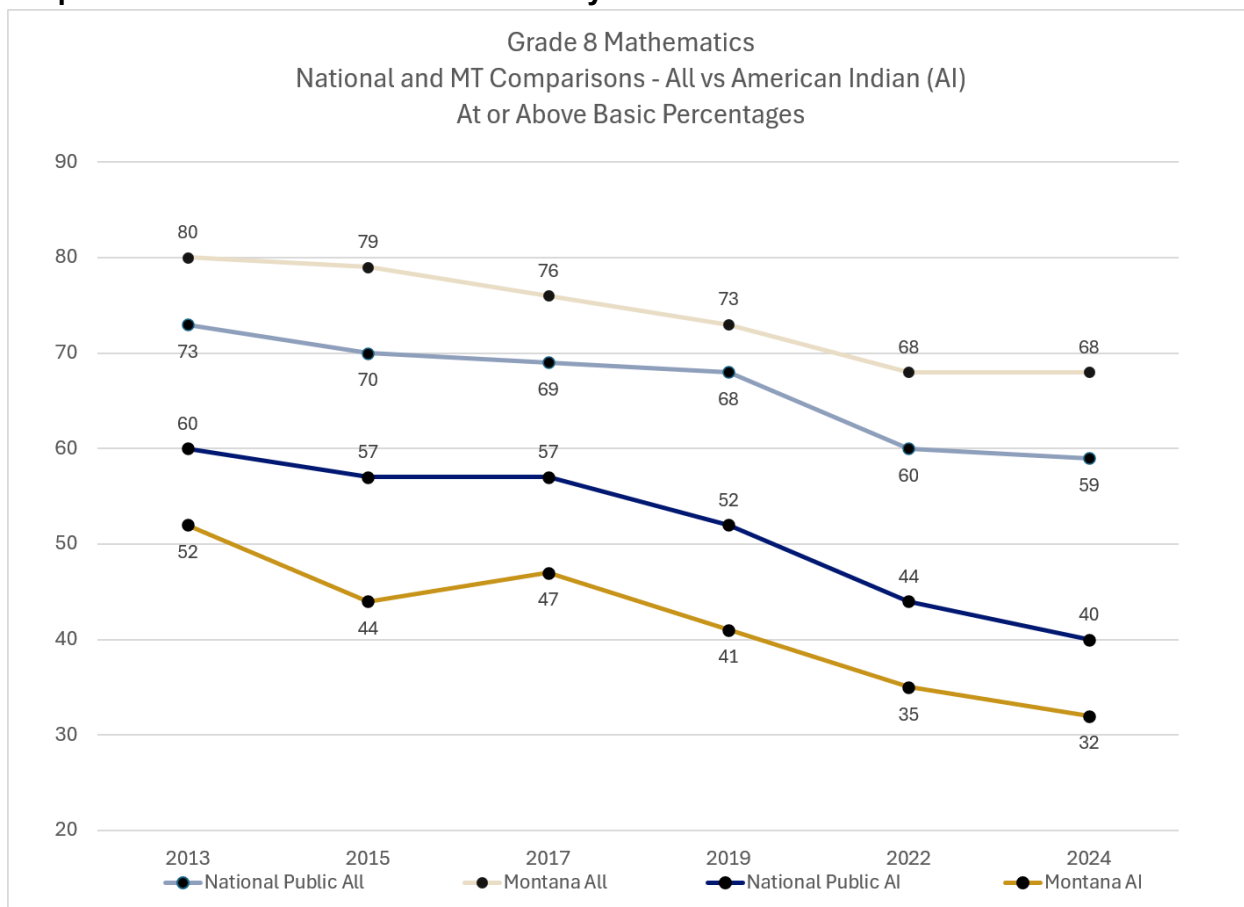
Graph 2. NAEP 4th Grade Reading Proficiency for AI and All Students 2013-2024

For the years shown, Montana students (*Montana All*) scored higher than the national average (*National Public All*) while Montana AI students (*Montana AI*) scored lower than the national average for AI students (*National Public AI*).

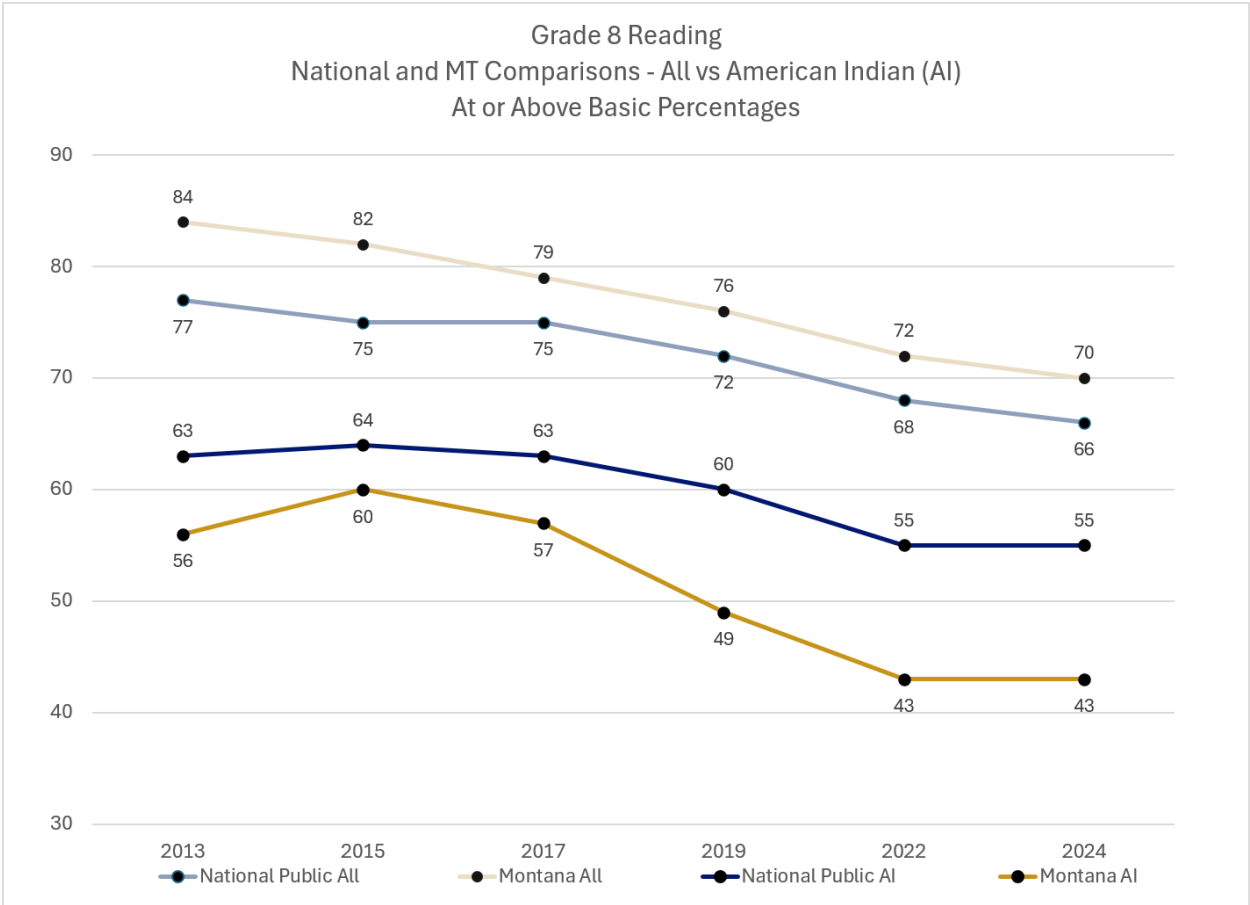
Graph 3. NAEP 8th Grade Math Proficiency for AI and All Students 2013-2024

Graph 3 shows the NAEP national and state trends for 8th grade American Indian (AI) students and all students in public schools that score "At or Above Basic" in mathematics. Similarly to 4th grade, for the years shown, Montana students as a whole (*Montana All*) scored higher than the national average (*National Public All*) while Montana AI students (*Montana AI*) scored lower than the national average for AI students (*National Public AI*).

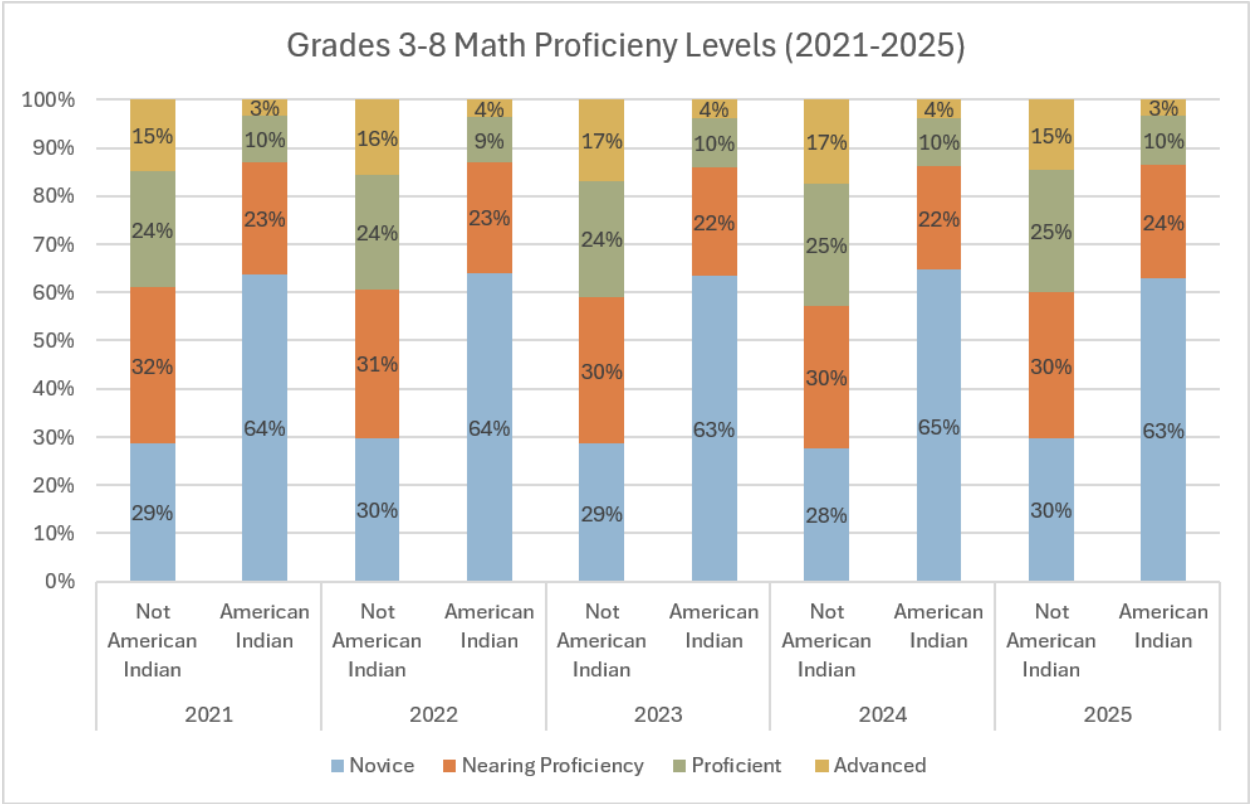
Graph 4 shows the NAEP national and state trends for 8th grade American Indian (AI) students and all students in public schools that score “At or Above Basic” in reading. For the years shown, Montana students (*Montana All*), scored higher than the national average (*National Public All*) while Montana AI students (*Montana AI*) scored lower than the national average for AI students (*National Public AI*). Between 2022 and 2024, the achievement scores for Montana AI (*Montana AI*) students and AI students nationally (*National Public AI*) did not change while the scores for Montana students (*Montana All*) and students nationally (*National Public All*) continued to trend downwards.

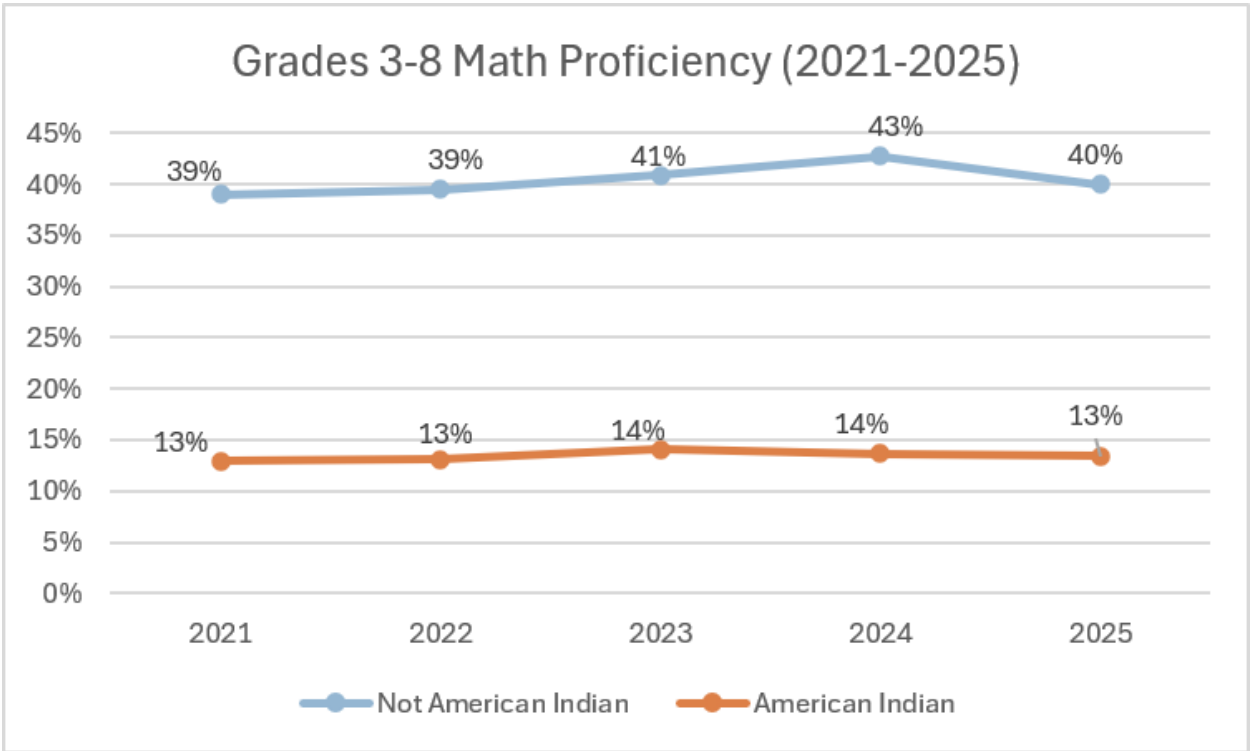

Graph 5. Grades 3-8 Math Proficiency Levels (2021-2025)



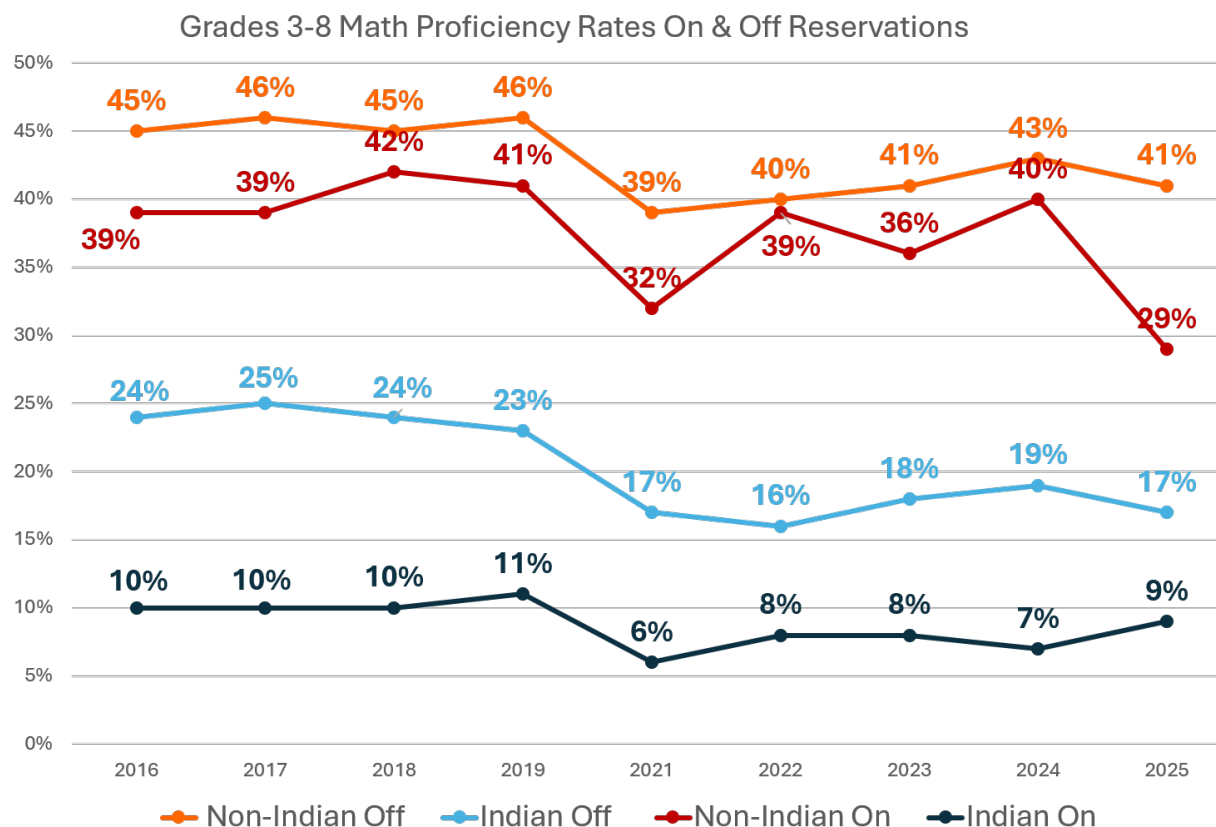
Graph 5 shows the math proficiency levels for AI and non-Indian students in grades 3-8 for the past five years.

Graph 6 illustrates the percentages of students who scored proficient or advanced in math between 2021 and 2025. The proficiency rate for AI and students remained relatively unchanged between 2021 and 2025, falling between 13% and 14%. Comparatively, the proficiency rates for non-Indian students fell between 39% and 43% for the same years.

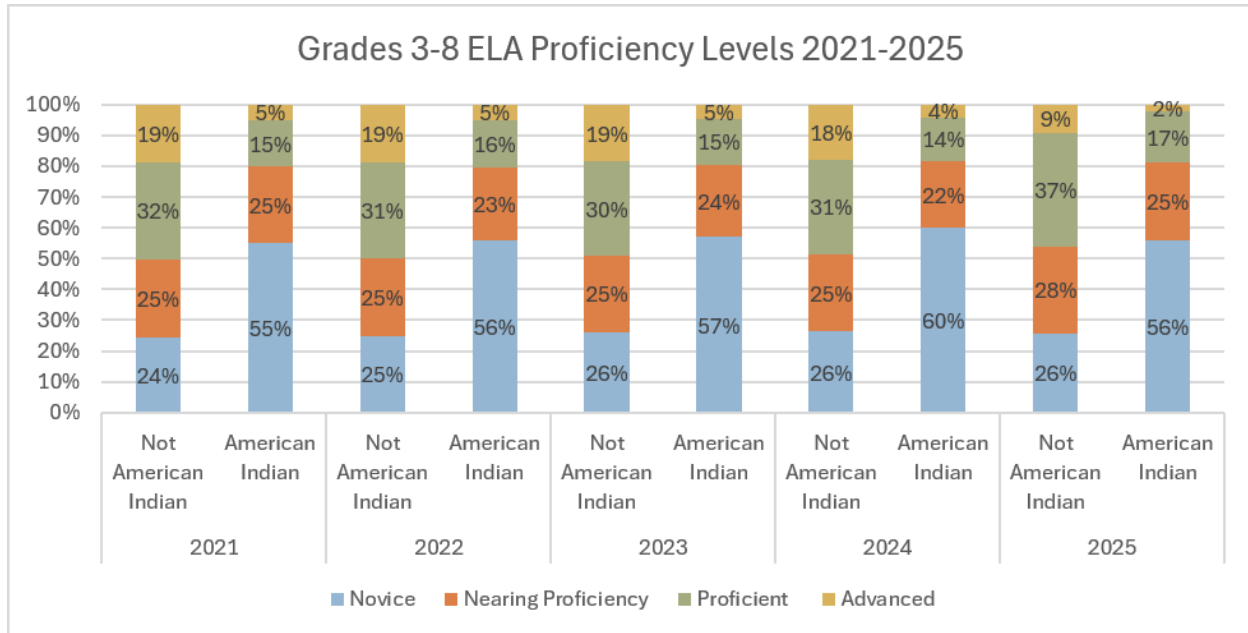
Graph 7. Grades 3-8 Math Proficiency Trends for Students Attending School On and Off Reservations (2016-2025)



Graph 7 illustrates the percentages of students who scored proficient or advanced in math between 2016 and 2025 for the following groups: Non-Indian students attending school off reservation (Non-Indian Off Reservation); American Indian students attending school off reservation (Indian Off Reservation); non-Indian students attending school on reservation (Non-Indian On Reservation); and Indian students attending school on reservation (Indian On Reservation). For all years shown, non-Indian students in grades 3-8 are achieving mathematically at a similar rate, regardless of attending school on or off a reservation, aside from a drop in achievement in non-Indian students attending school on reservation in 2025.

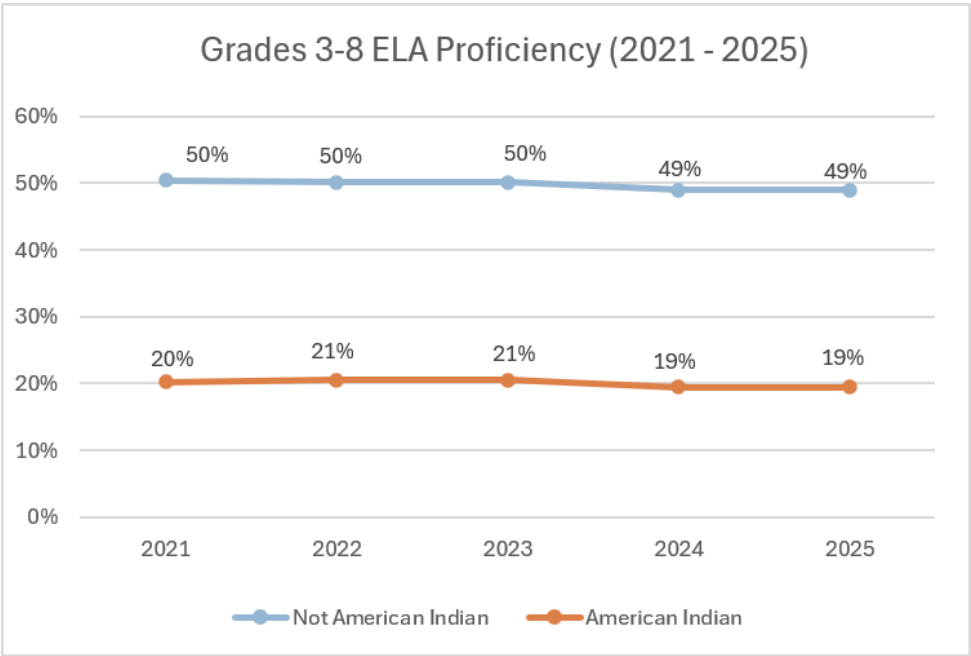

Graph 8. Grades 3-8 ELA Proficiency Levels 2021-2025



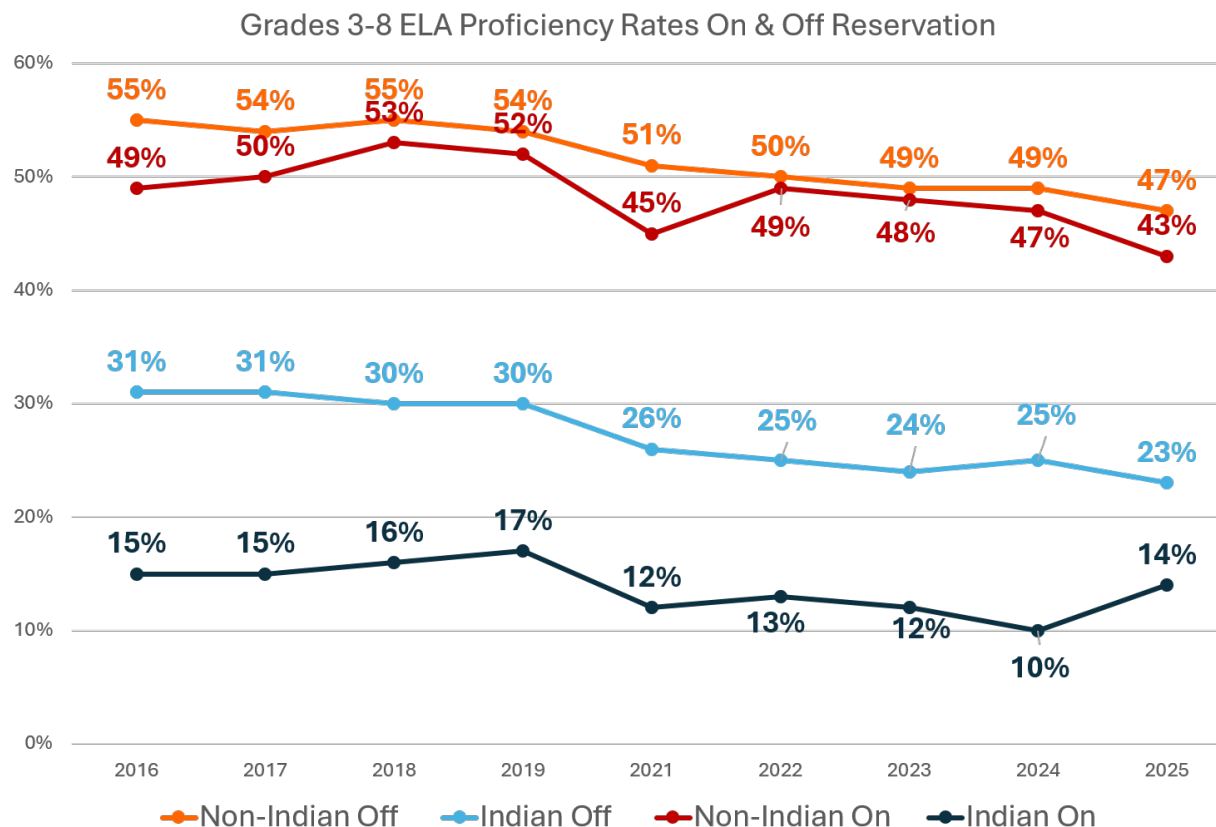
Graph 8 shows the ELA proficiency levels for AI and non-Indian students grades 3-8 for the past five years. Between 2024 and 2025, the percentage of AI students scoring Novice in ELA fell from 60% to 56% while the percentage of AI students scoring proficient (proficient and/or advanced) remained the same at 19%.

Graph 9 illustrates the percentages of students who scored proficient or advanced in ELA between 2021 and 2025. The proficiency rate for AI and students remained relatively unchanged between 2021 and 2025, falling between 19% and 21%. Comparatively, the proficiency rates for non-Indian students fell between 49% and 50% for the same years.

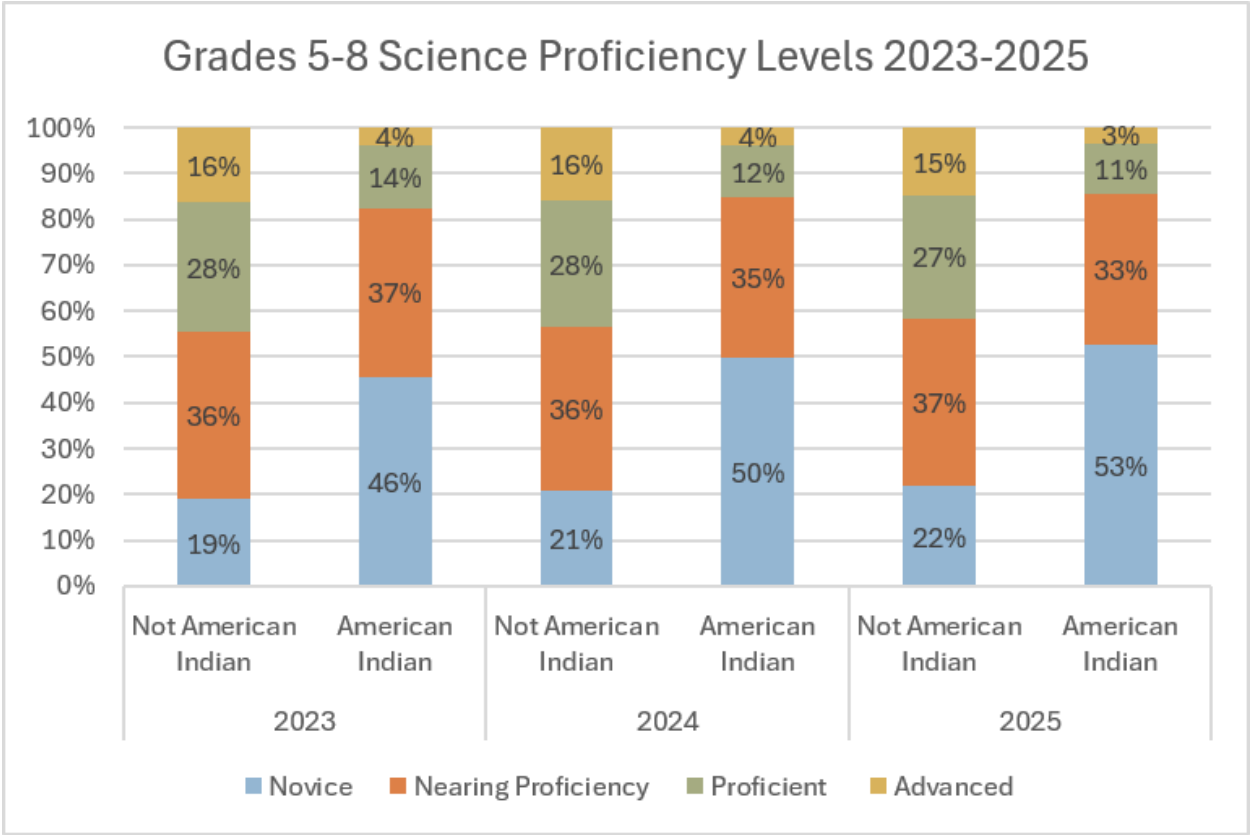
Graph 10. Grades 3-8 ELA Proficiency Trends for Students Attending School On and Off Reservations (2016-2025)



Graph 10 illustrates the percentages of students who scored proficient or advanced in ELA between 2016 and 2025 for the following groups: Non-Indian students attending school off reservation (Non-Indian Off); American Indian students attending school off reservation (Indian Off); non-Indian students attending school on reservation (Non-Indian On); and Indian students attending school on reservation (Indian On). For all years shown, non-Indian students in grades 3-8 are achieving in ELA at a similar rate, regardless of attending school on or off a reservation.

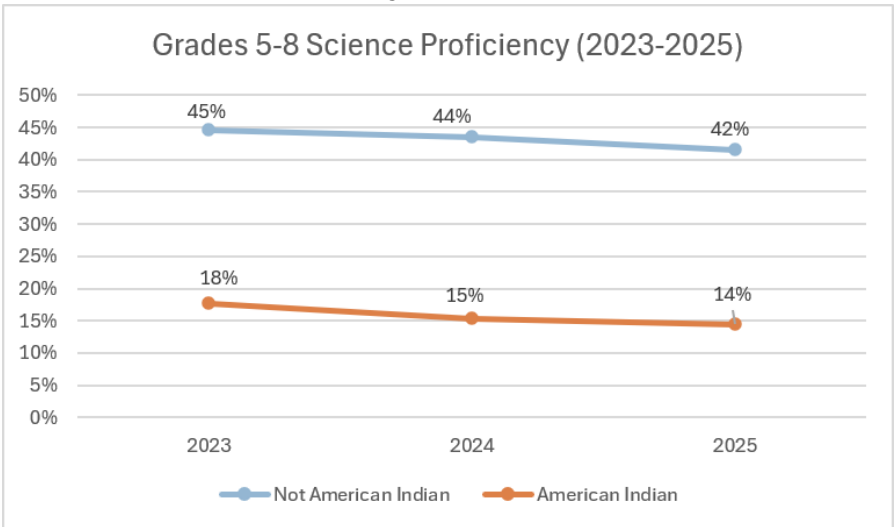

Graph 11 shows the science proficiency levels for AI and non-Indian students in grades 5-8 for the past three years. Between 2023 and 2025, the percentage of AI students scoring Novice in science increased from 46% to 53%.

Graph 12. Grades 5-8 Science Proficiency Rates (2023-2025)

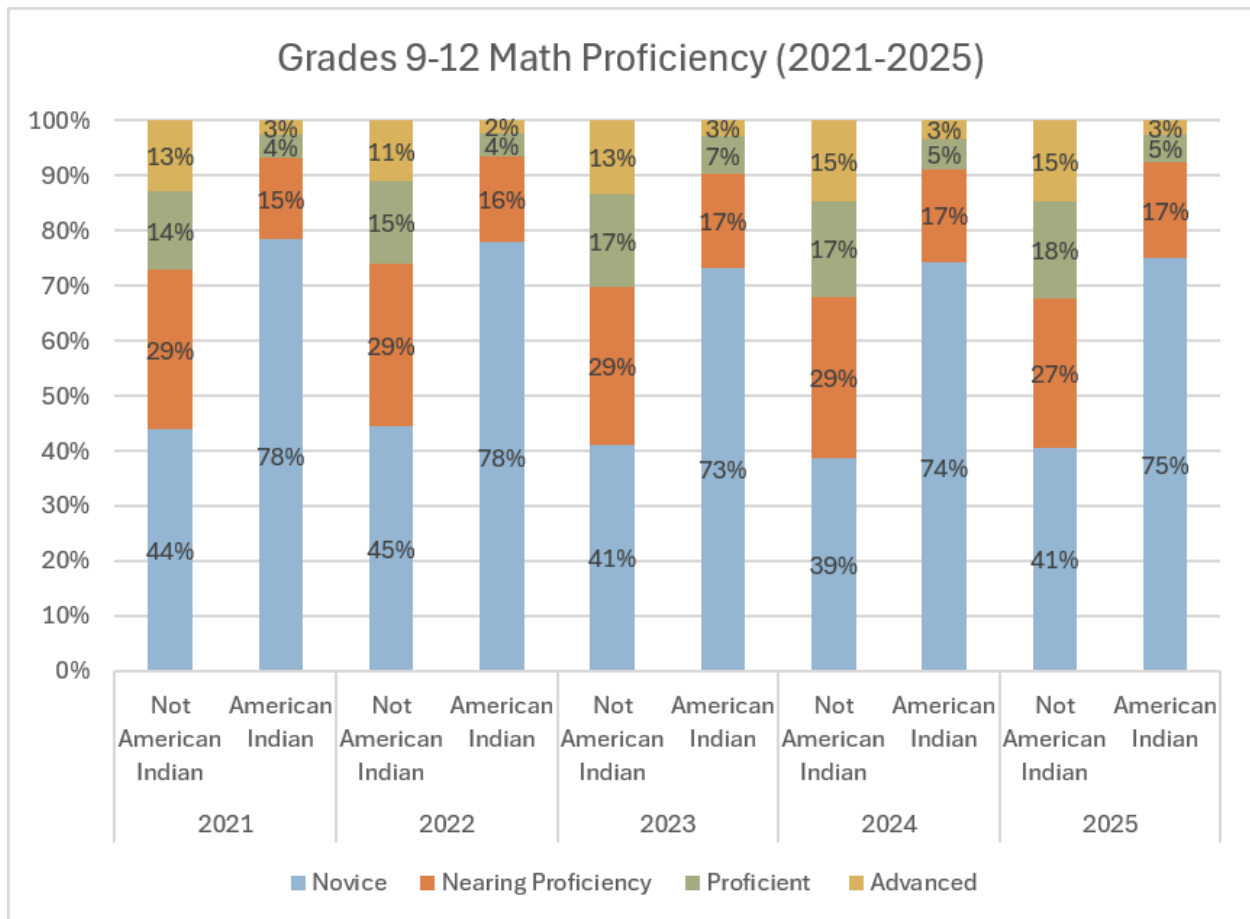


Graph 12 illustrates the percentages of students grades 5-8 who scored proficient or advanced in science between 2023 and 2025. The proficiency rate for AI students fell from 18% in 2023 to 14% in 2025.

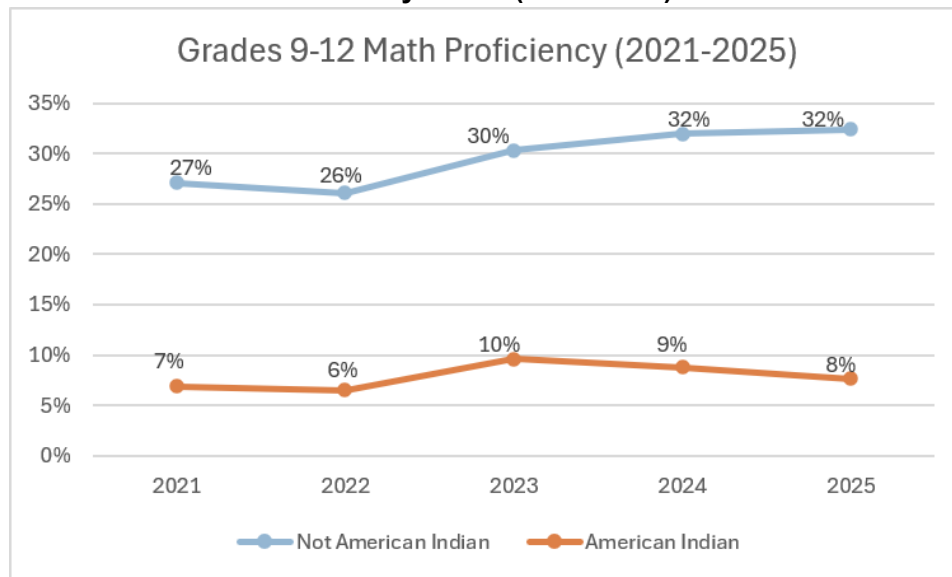

Graph 13. Grades 9-12 Math Proficiency Levels (2021-2025)



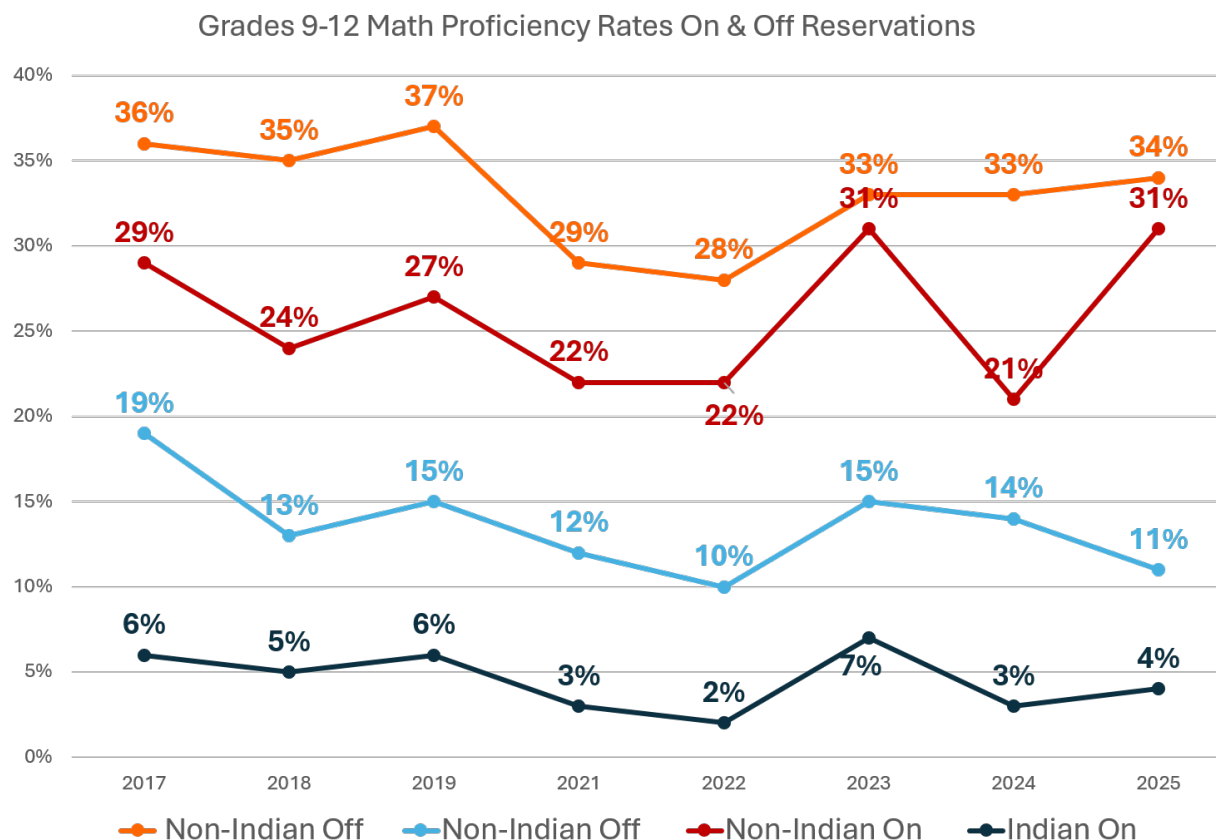
Graph 13 shows the math proficiency levels for AI and non-Indian students in grades 9-12 for the past five years. Between 2021 and 2025, the percentage of AI students scoring Novice in high school math fell from 78% to 75%, a 3% decrease.

Graph 14 illustrates the percentages of students who scored proficient or advanced in high school math between 2021 and 2025. The proficiency rate for AI students fell from 10% in 2023 to 8% in 2025.

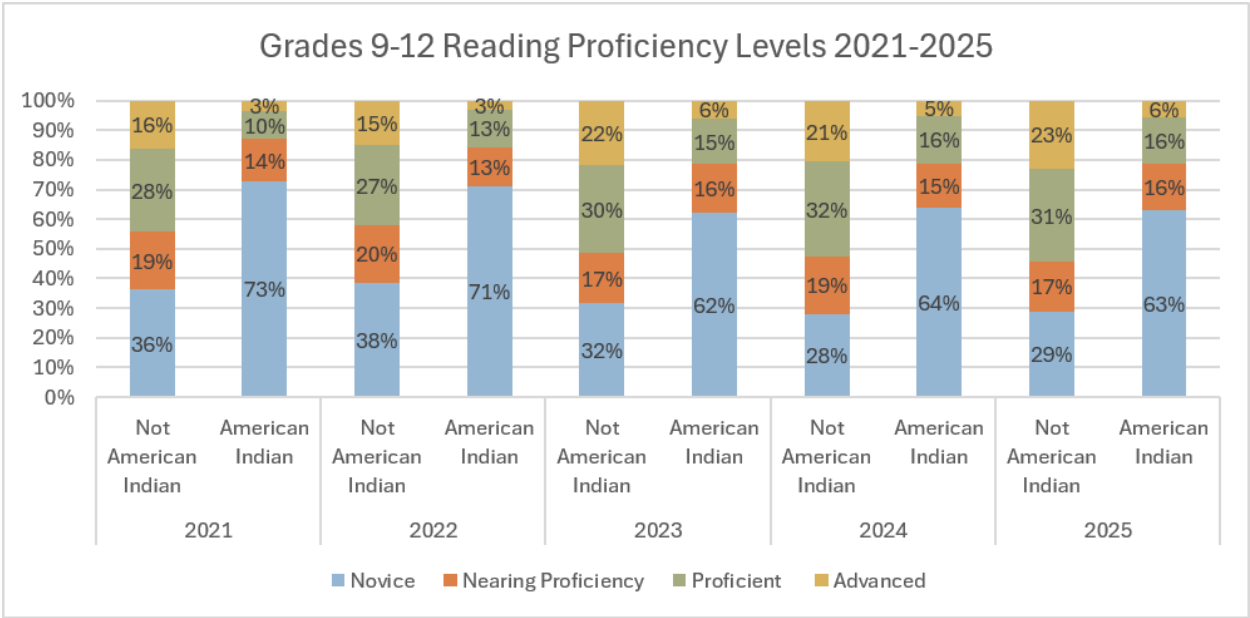
Graph 15. Grades 9-12 Math Proficiency Trends for Students Attending School On and Off Reservations (2016-2025)



Graph 15 illustrates the percentages of students who scored proficient or advanced in high school math between 2016 and 2025 for the following groups: Non-Indian students attending school off reservation (Non-Indian Off); American Indian students attending school off reservation (Indian Off); non-Indian students attending school on reservation (Non-Indian On); and Indian students attending school on reservation (Indian On). The proficiency rates for all groups fell between 2023 and 2024 except for non-Indian students attending school off reservation whose proficiency rate remained the same at 33%.

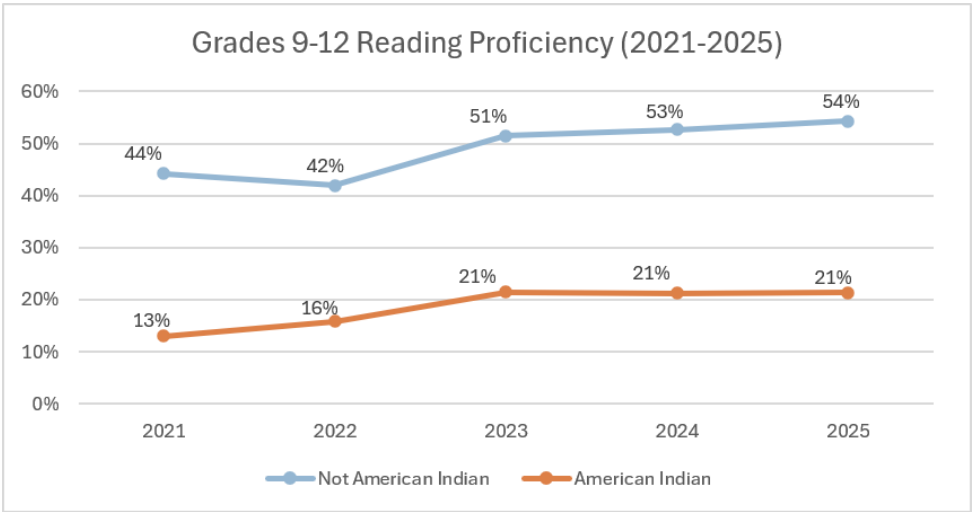

Graph 16. Grades 9-12 Reading Proficiency Levels (2021-2025)



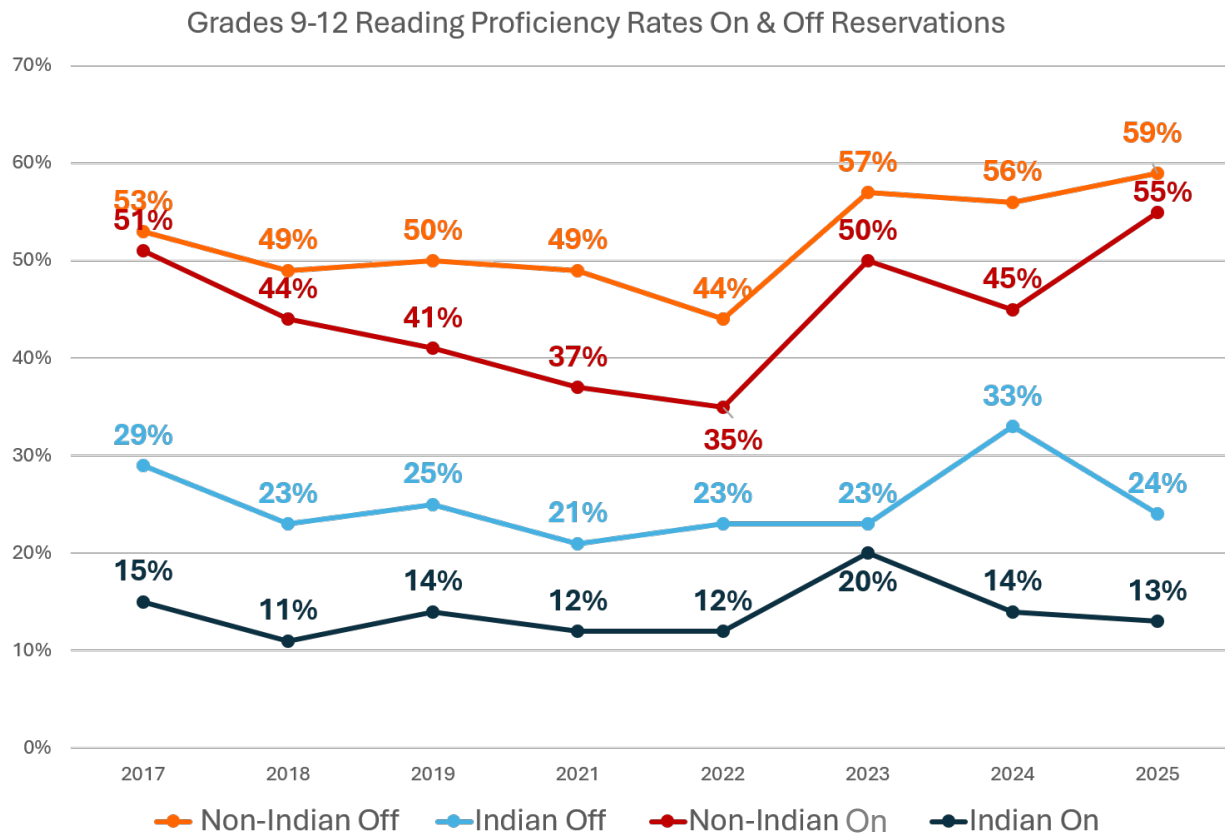
Graph 16 shows the reading proficiency levels for AI and non-Indian students grades 9-12 for the past five years. Between 2021 and 2025, the percentage of AI students scoring Novice in high school math fell by 10% from 73% to 63%.

Graph 17 illustrates the percentages of students who scored proficient or advanced in high school reading between 2021 and 2025. The proficiency rate for AI students increased from 13% in 2021 to 21% in 2025, an increase of 8 percentage points.

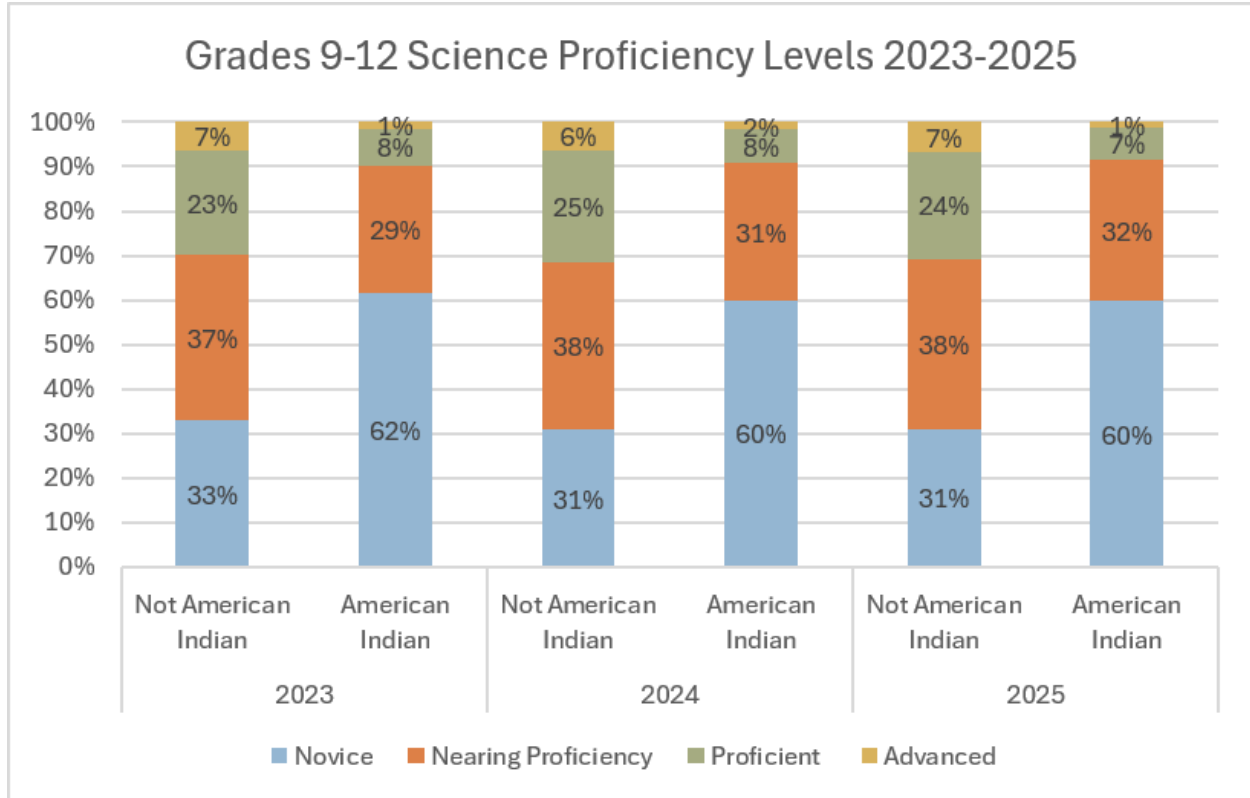
Graph 18. Grades 9-12 Reading Proficiency Trends for Students Attending School On and Off Reservations (2016-2025)



Graph 18 illustrates the percentages of students who scored proficient or advanced in high school reading between 2016 and 2025 for the following groups: Non-Indian students attending school off reservation (Non-Indian Off); American Indian students attending school off reservation (Indian Off); non-Indian students attending school on reservation (Non-Indian On); and Indian students attending school on reservation (Indian On). The proficiency rates for all groups fell between 2023 and 2024 except for AI students attending school off reservation whose proficiency rate increased from 23% to 33%.

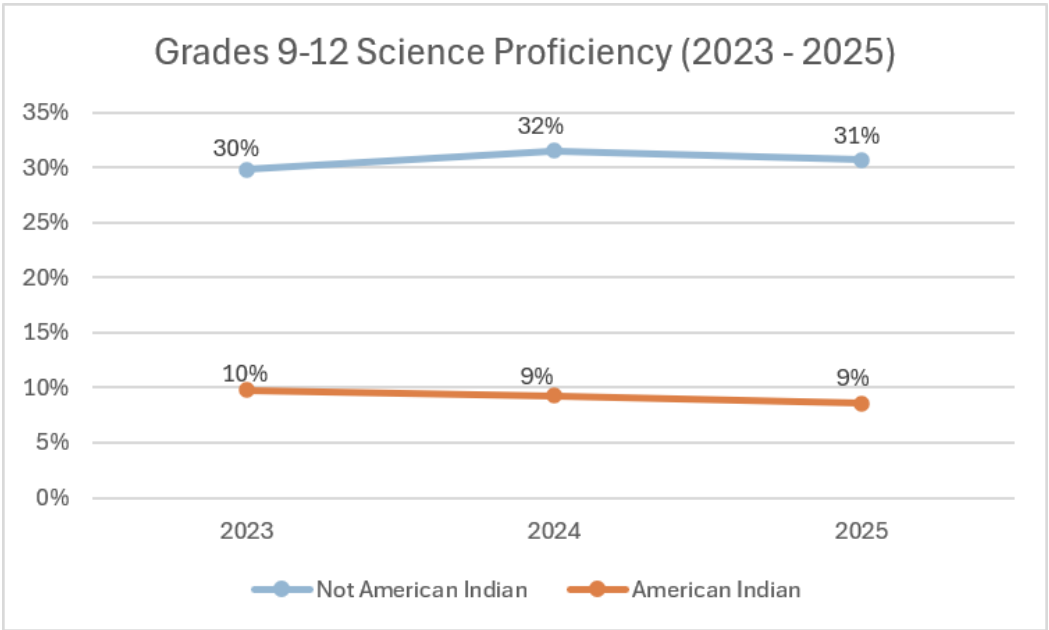

Graph 19. Grades 9-12 Science Proficiency Levels (2023-2025)



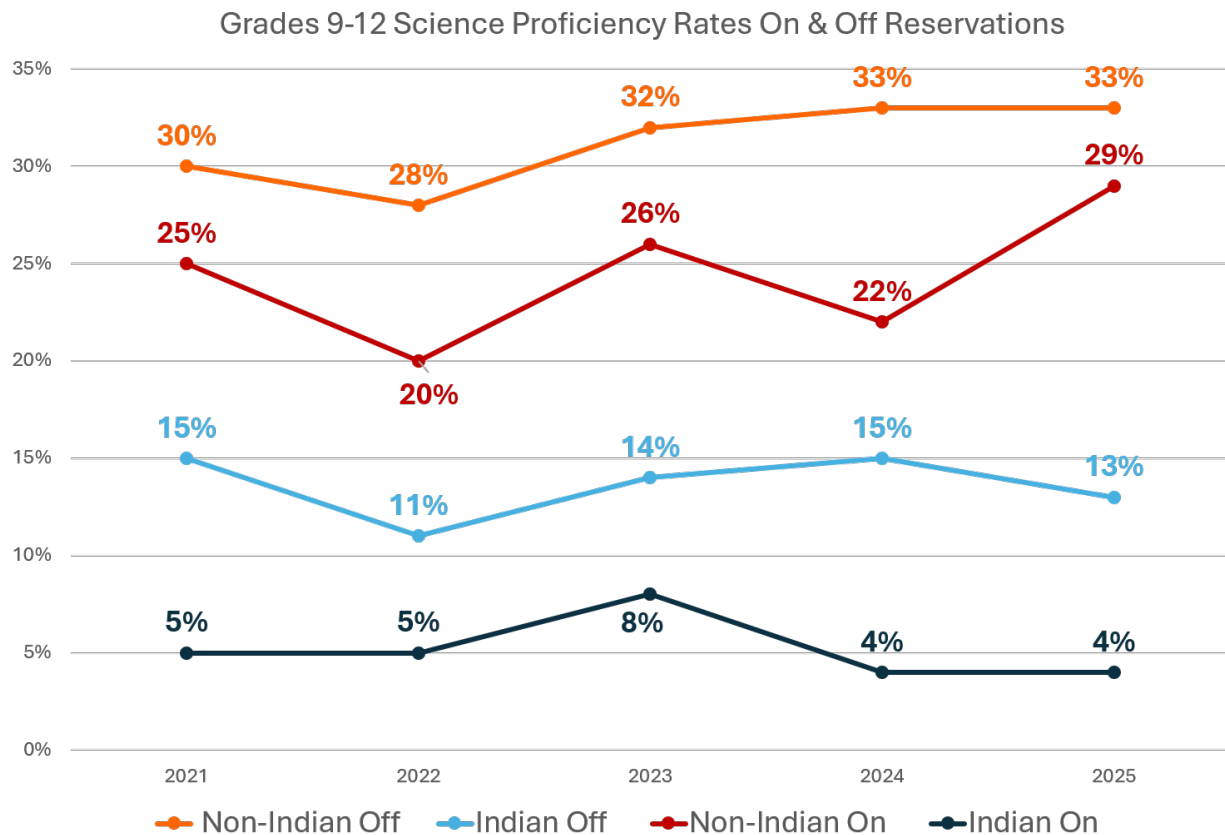
Graph 19 shows the science proficiency levels for AI and non-Indian students grades 9-12 for the past three years. Between 2023 and 2025, the percentage of AI students scoring Novice in high school science fell from 62% to 60%.

Graph 20 illustrates the percentages of students who scored proficient or advanced in high school science between 2023 and 2025. The proficiency rate for AI students decreased from 10% in 2023 to 9% in 2025.

Graph 21 illustrates the percentages of students who scored proficient or advanced in high school science between 2021 and 2025 for the following groups: Non-Indian students attending school off reservation (Non-Indian Off); American Indian students attending school off reservation (Indian Off); non-Indian students attending school on reservation (Non-Indian On); and Indian students attending school on reservation (Indian On). For all years displayed, non-Indian students attending school off reservations achieved the highest rate of proficiency in science while AI students attending school on reservations achieved the lowest.

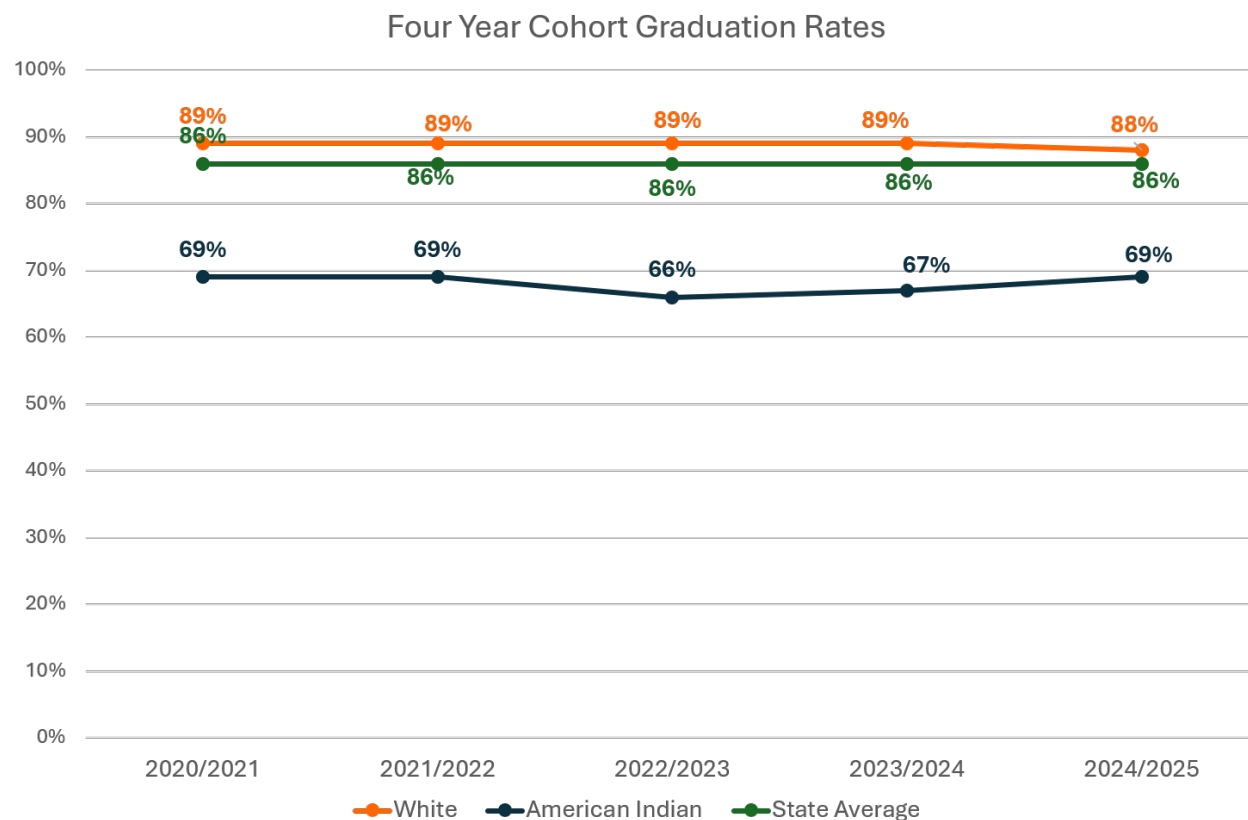

As displayed in Table 2, the achievement gap between AI and non-Indian students has increased slightly over the past 3 to 5 years, except for ELA for students in grades 3-8, which saw no change in achievement gap percentage between 2021 and 2025. The smallest achievement gap between AI and non-Indian students is in high school (grades 9-12) science while the greatest gap is in high school (grades 9-12) reading.

Cohort Adjusted Graduation Rates

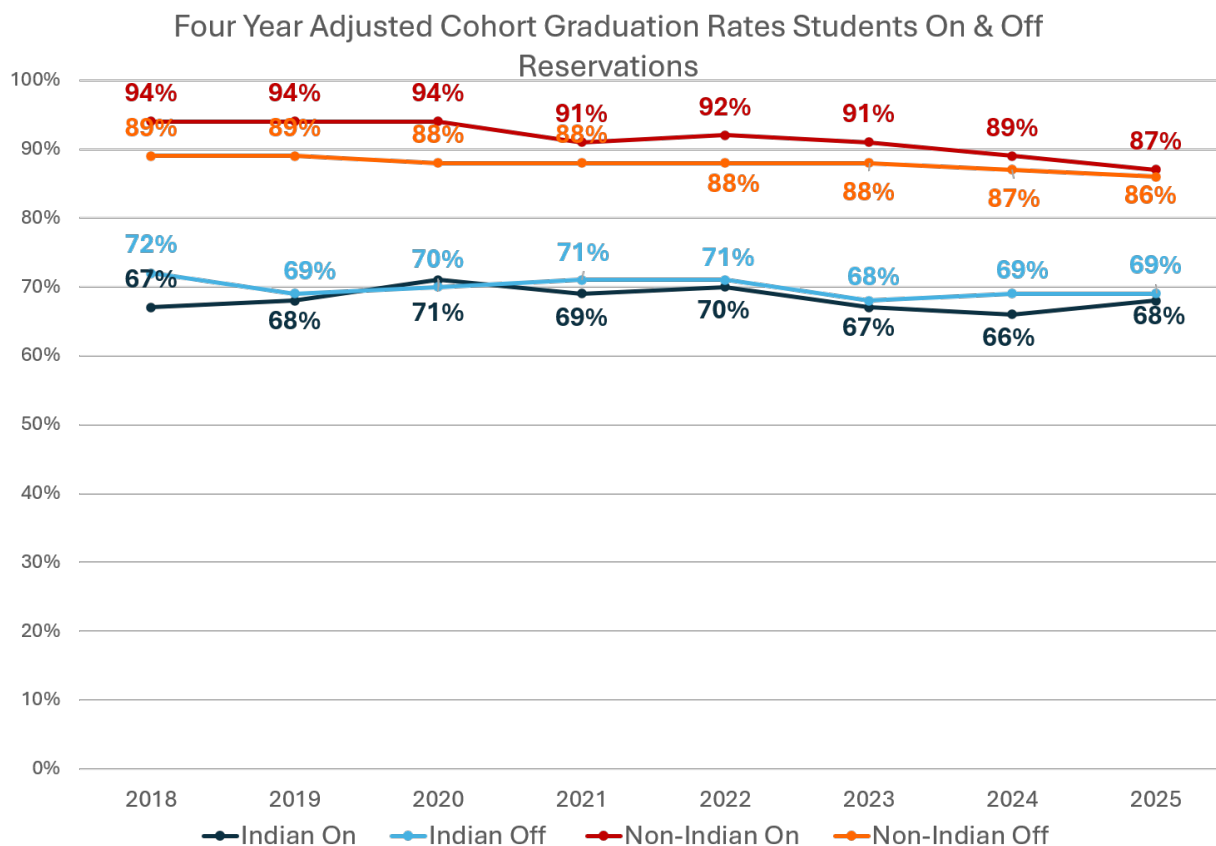
Graph 22. Four-Year Adjusted Cohort Graduations Rates for American Indian, White, and Montana as a Whole, 2021-2025

Graph 22 illustrates the four-year adjusted cohort graduation rates for AI students, white students, and Montana as a whole for the past five years. Trendlines for each group remained primarily consistent for the years shown, with AI students graduating at a rate of approximately 20 points less than white students.

Graph 23. Four-Year Adjusted Cohort Graduations Rates for American Indian and Non-Indian Students On and Off Reservations (2021-2025)



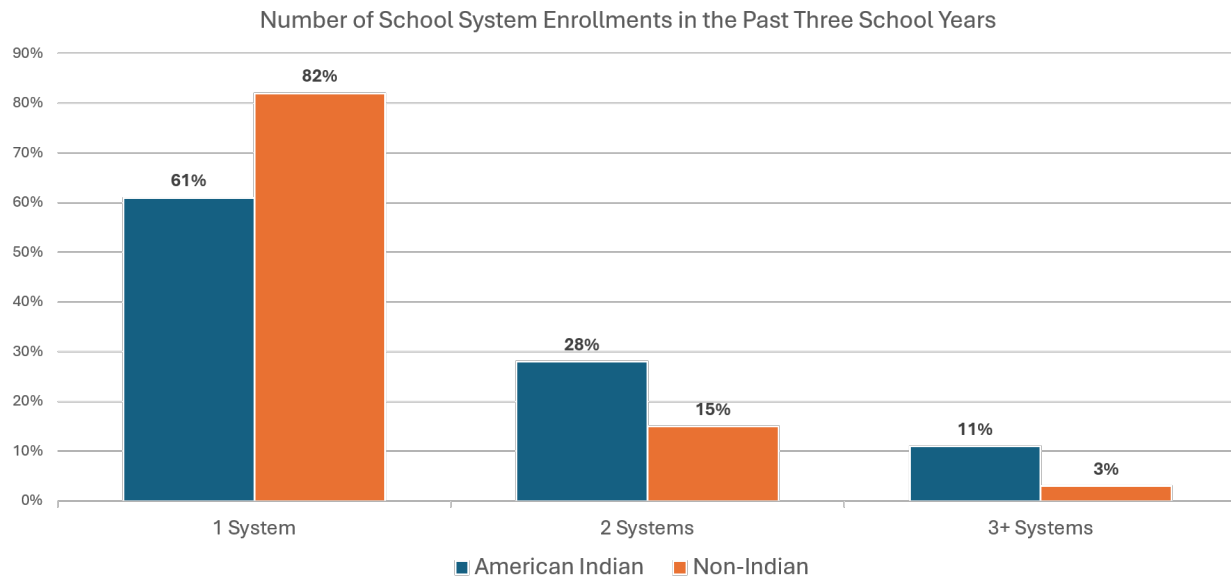

Graph 23 illustrates the four-year graduation cohort rates for four student groups for eight school years. Non-Indian students attending schools on reservations reported the highest graduation rate for all years shown. AI students graduated at a similar rate for the years shown, regardless of attending school on or off reservations. The average graduation rate for the four student groups for the years shown is:

- 92% for non-Indian students attending schools on reservations
- 88% for non-Indian students attending schools off reservations
- 70% for Indian students attending schools off reservation
- 68% for Indian students attending schools on reservations

Graph 24. Percentage of American Indian and Non-Indian Students Enrolling in 1, 2, or 3+ School Systems Within a 3-Year Time Span

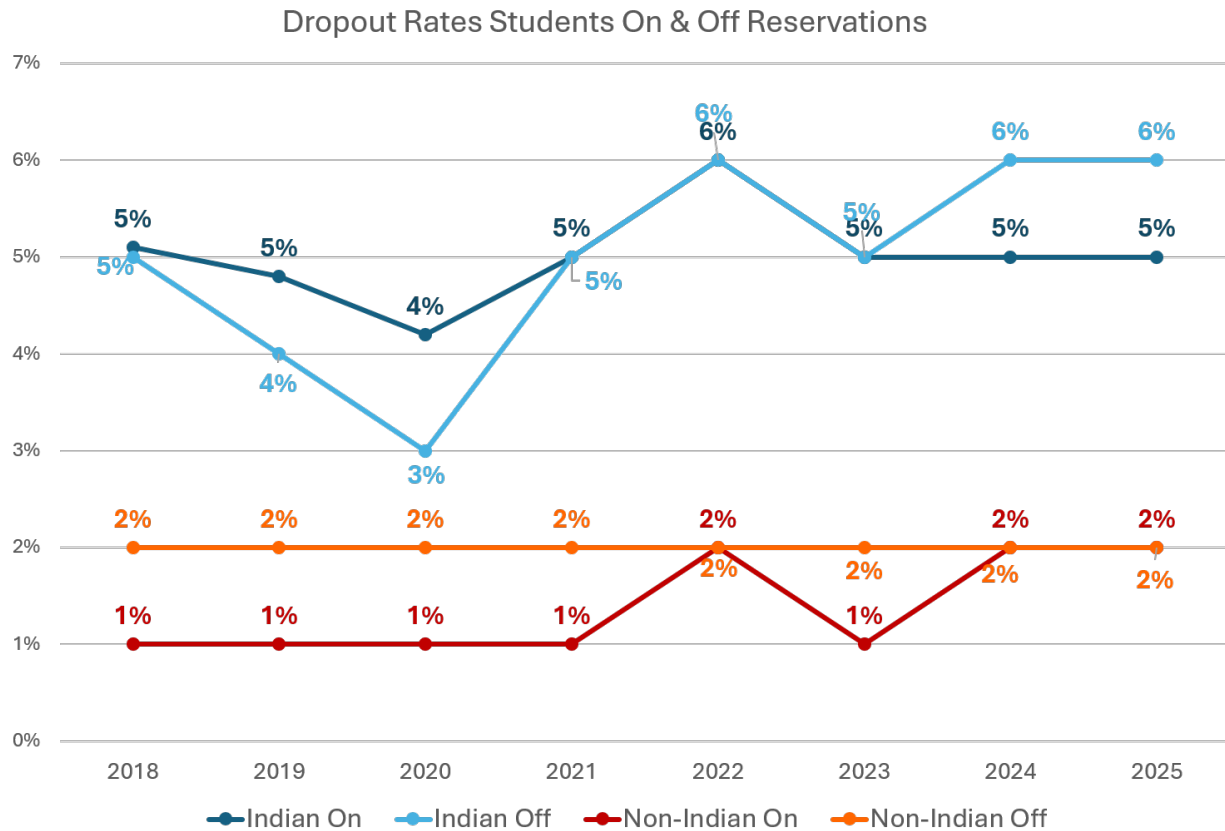

Graph 24 shows the number of school systems AI and non-Indian students enroll in within a three-year time span. AI students as a whole, enroll in more school systems over time as compared to non-Indian students, with 61% of AI students enrolling in a single school system within a three-year period as compared to 82% of non-Indian students, a difference of 21 percentage points.

Dropout Rates

Graph 25 displays the dropout rate for four student groups for years 2018- 2023. The dropout rate of AI students attending school on reservation was equal to, or within one percentage point, of the drop-out rate of AI students attending schools off reservations for the years shown. Likewise, the drop-out rate for non-Indian students was equal, or within 1 percentage point, regardless of attending schools on or off reservations. The average drop-out rate for the four student groups for the years shown is:

- 1% for non-Indian students attending schools on reservations
- 2% for non-Indian students attending schools off reservations
- 5% for Indian students attending schools off reservation
- 5% for Indian students attending schools on reservations

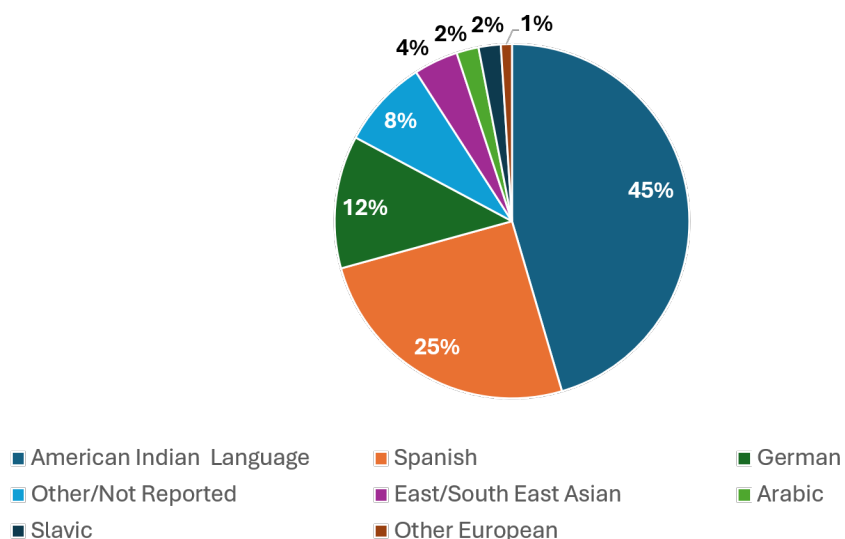

Table 3 displays the total number and percentage of American Indian students identified as ELs. In the most recent school year, 14% (1,936 students) of American Indian students were designated as EL as compared to 3% (4,720) of students in the entire state. Between 2018 and 2024, over half of the state's EL students were American Indian; in the 2025/2026 school year, 41% of Montana's EL students were American Indian.

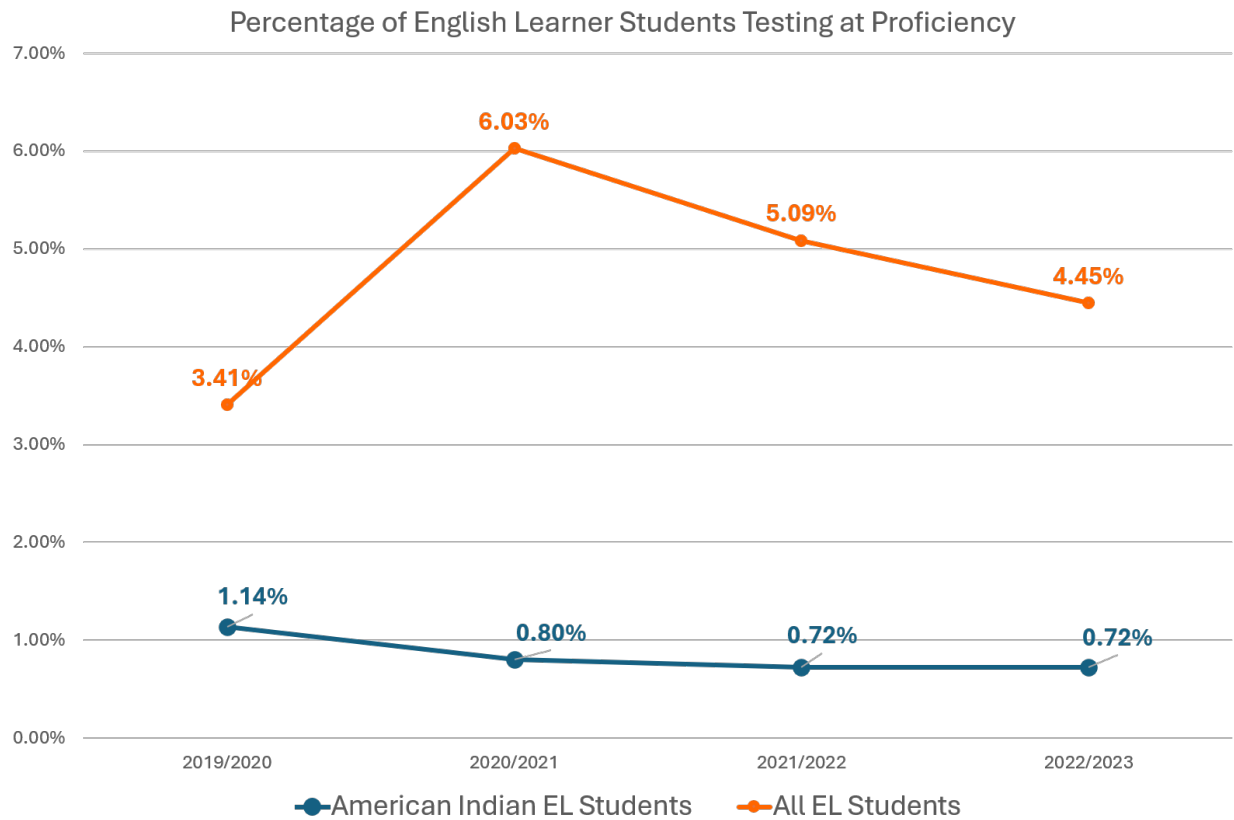
Figure 2. 2023/2024 English Learner Language of Impact for All Montana Students

A language of impact refers to a non-English language spoken in a student’s home or community that significantly influences their linguistic environment, communication patterns, or academic English acquisition. Figure 2 shows the language of impact for all Montana English Learner students for the 2023/2024 school year. During the year displayed, 45% of English Learner students reported an American Indian language as a language of impact. An additional 25% of students reported Spanish and 12% reported German.

Graph 25 shows the percentage of AI and non-Indian EL students testing at proficiency levels. The most recent data available shows approximately 4% of all Montana EL students tested proficient compared to less than 1% of Montana AI EL students.

Special Education Data

The rate of American Indian students in Special Education is disproportionately higher than the overall racial/ethnic composition of Montana’s schools. In 2023, OPI data indicated that there were 3,601 American Indian students receiving Special Education services. In 2024, 2,855 American Indian students received Special Education Services.

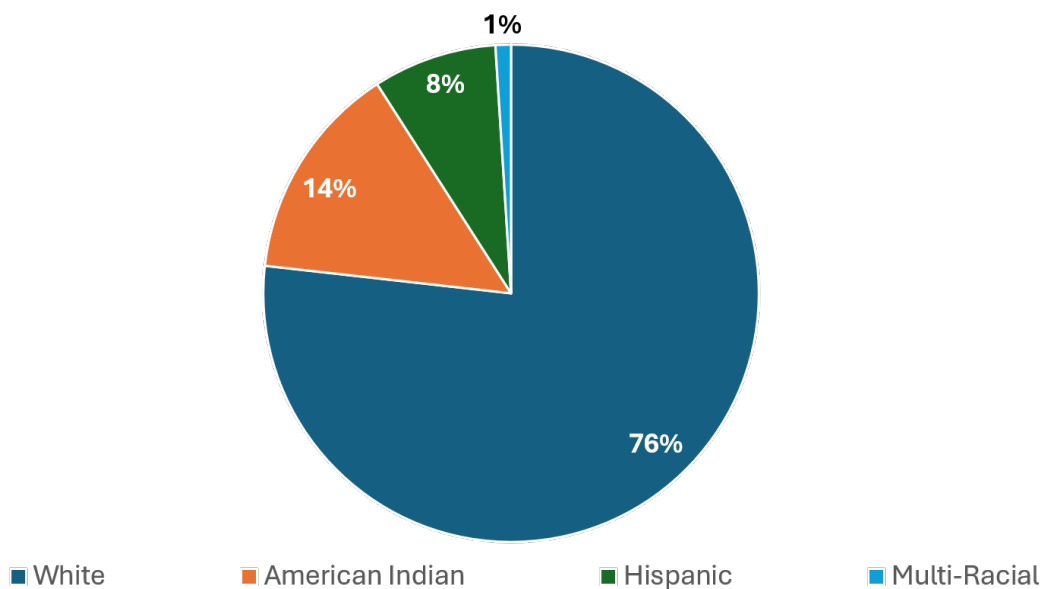

Table 4 shows the number of students receiving special education services in 2025/2026 by race and ethnicity. During this school year, 2,909 AI students received special education.

As displayed in Figure 4, approximately 14% of students who received special education in the 2025/2026 school year were AI.

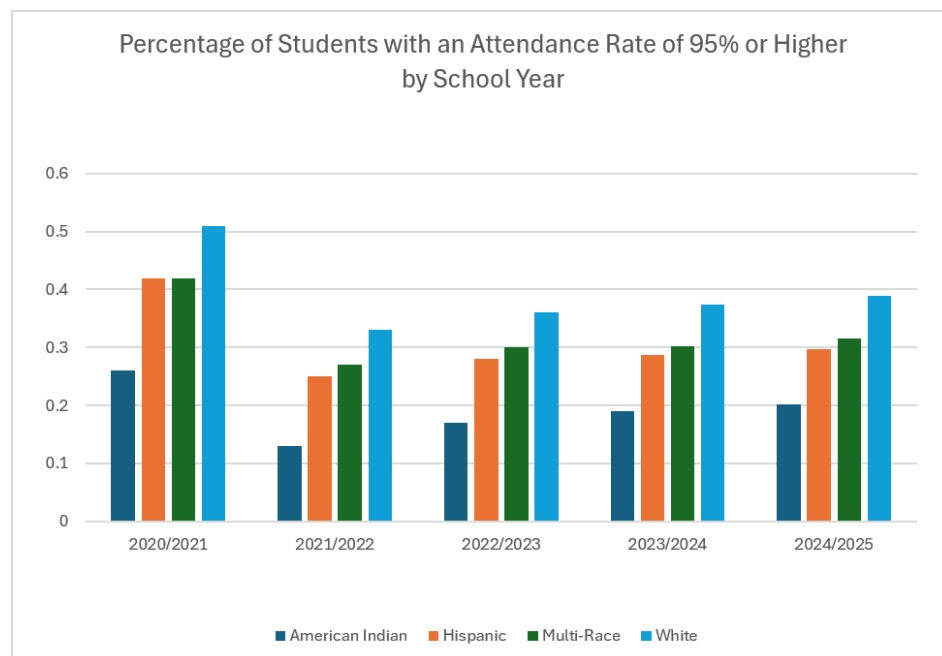

Table 5 shows the percentage of students attending 95% or more days of school per school year by race/ethnicity. The graph below shows the same data for four racial/ethnic groups. All racial/ethnic groups saw a drop in attendance from 2020/2021 to 2021/2022 and then a slight increase from 2021/2022 to 2022/2023. Though attendance rates for AI students increased from 13% in 2021/2022 to 20% in 2024/2025, AI students continue to have the lowest rate of students attending school 95% or more days during a school year.

Graph 26. Percentage of Students with an Attendance Rate of 95% or Higher Per School Year



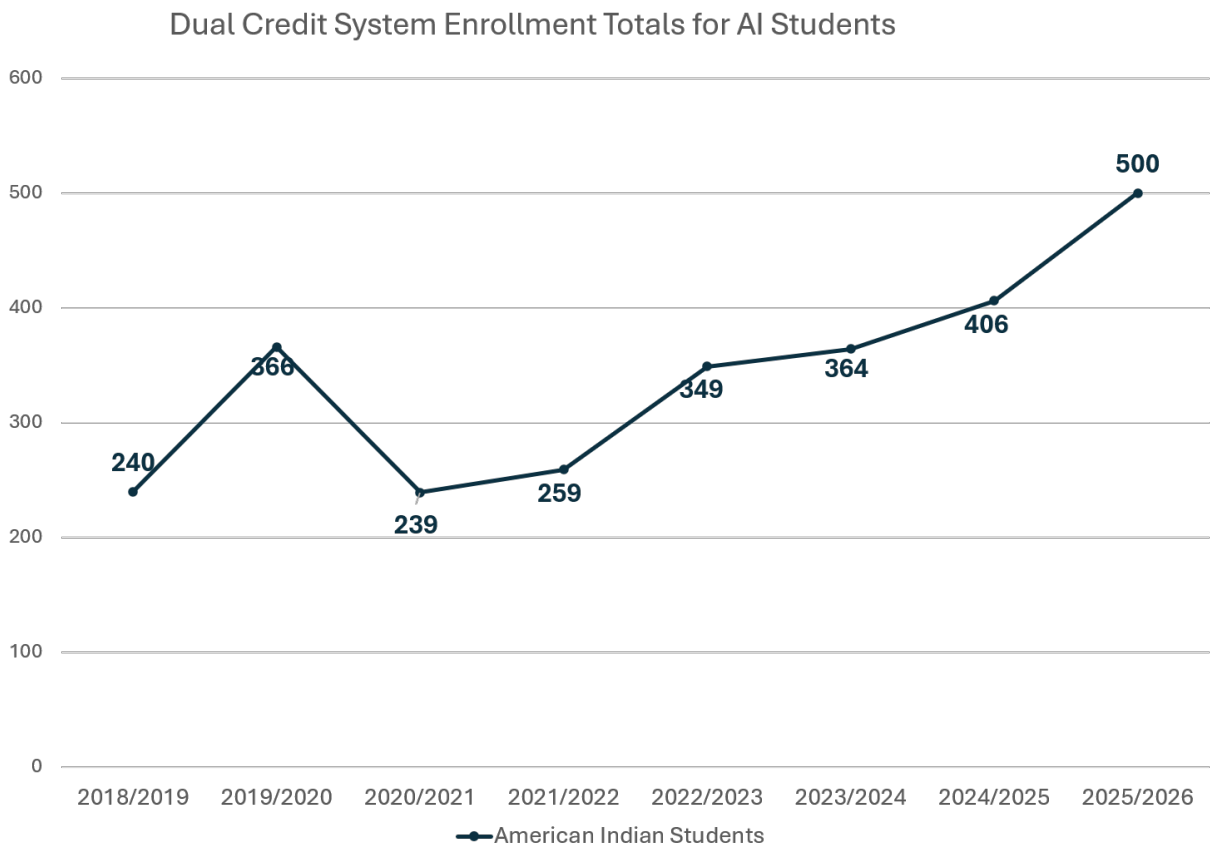
Graph 26 (previous page) shows the percentage of students with an attendance rate of 95% or higher for the past five school years by race/ethnicity. Attendance rates for all groups dropped following school closures due to COVID. Since the 2021/2022 school year, however, attendance has been increasing for all groups. For all years shown, AI students have the lowest attendance rate when compared to other racial/ethnic groups. In the 2024/2025 school year, 20% of AI students attended 95%+ of school days compared to 39% of white students.

Dual and College Enrollment

The Montana University System tracks American Indian student enrollment in Dual Credit coursework as well as the enrollment and completion rates for two-year degrees, community colleges, four-year degrees, Master’s degrees, and Doctoral degrees.

Graph 39. Dual Credit System Totals for American Indian (AI) Students



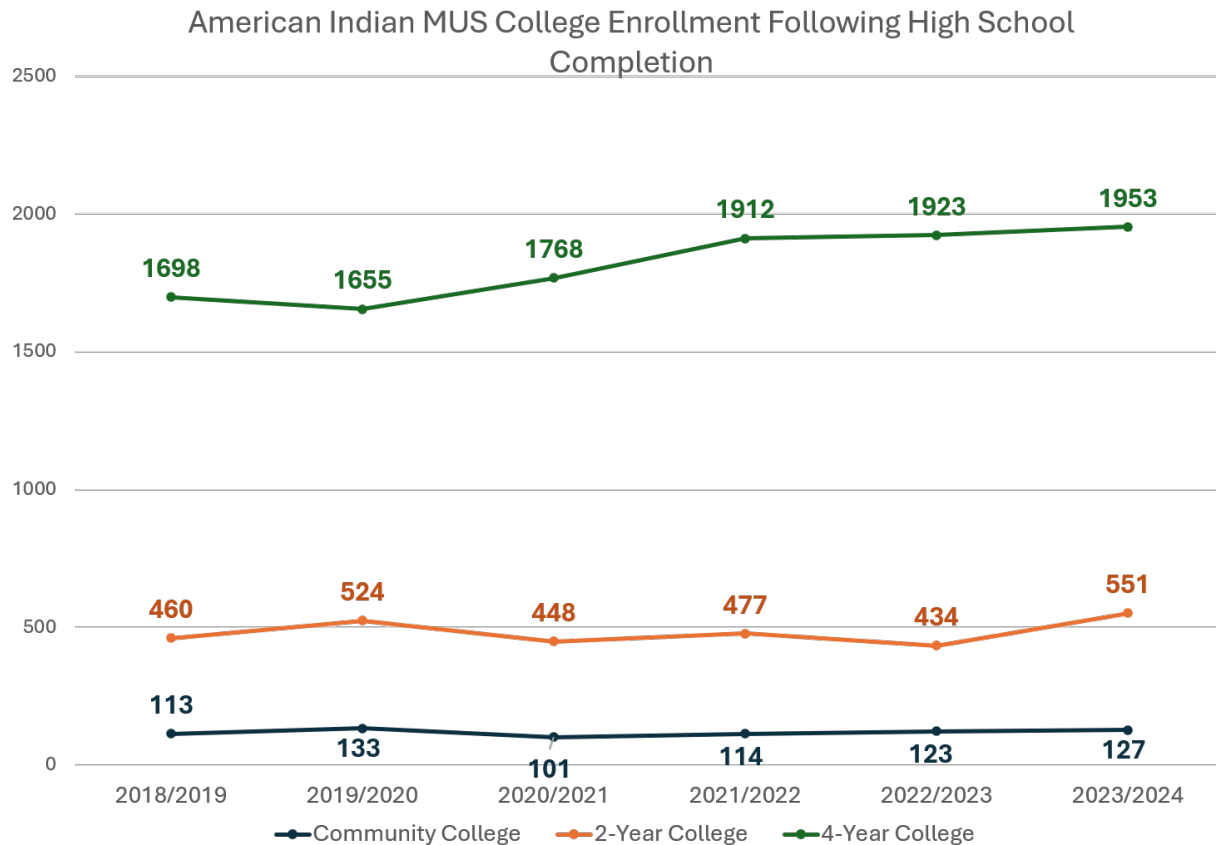

Graph 39 Shows that enrollment for American Indian students in dual-credit courses has consistently risen with one significant drop during the Covid Pandemic. Note that term counts are not equated to year counts because students may take more than one course per year. The

highest numbers of American Indian dual enrollment students are enrolled at City College in Billings followed by Missoula, Flathead and Great Falls. The lowest enrollments are at Dawson and Western, where there are fewer nearby reservations and Urban Indian Centers.

Graph 40. American Indian Students transferring to the Montana University System after graduation

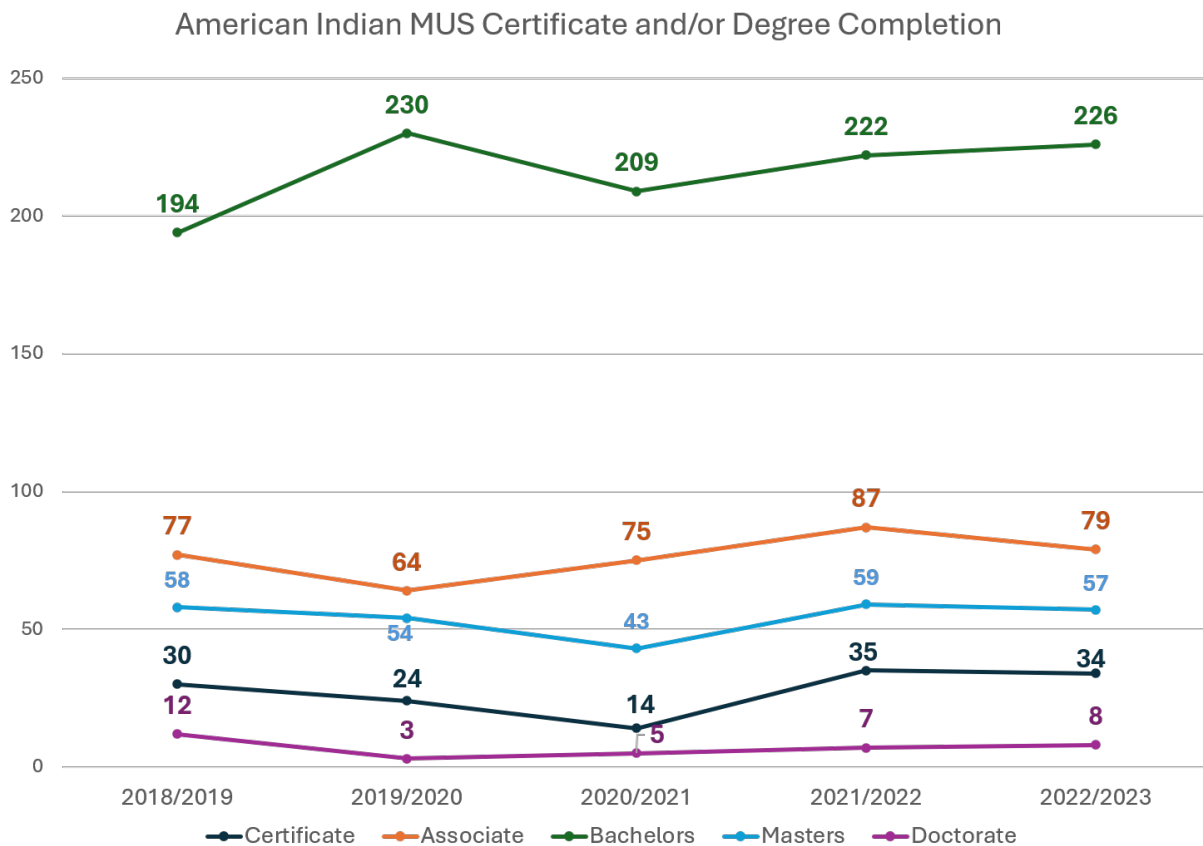

The number of students enrolling in the Montana University System continues to rise. The greatest gains are seen between 2022-23 and 2023-24 for American Indian student enrollments in two-year colleges. Modest gains were seen in four-year college enrollments.

Graph 41 shows the number of students completing four-year degrees continues to rise after the Covid Pandemic drop in 2019-2020. Small losses have been noted for Associate Degree programs but no significant changes were seen in Certificate, Master's, or Doctoral degrees.
